Before enrolling in CodaKid's Game Development 1 with Roblox course, we wanted to provide you with some important safety information.

Roblox is a safe 3rd party game creation engine that is housed outside of the CodaKid platform. It is used by over 70M people all over the world, including thousands of schools and colleges.

**Important Note:** Roblox as a platform allows students over the age of 13 access to interactive multiplayer gaming and chat with fellow gamers. Many of our parents choose to restrict this feature for child safety reasons.

Students under the age of 13 are automatically restricted from all social functions, provided that when you register for your free Roblox account you put in the correct birth year of your child. Please ensure that this is performed correctly.

For parents of students age 13 and up who wish to disable Roblox multiplayer gaming, chat, and social functions, here are two important resources that will allow you to set up parental controls.

Roblox even provides you with a Parent PIN to prevent your child from using Settings to remove these restrictions.
